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## About Wildlife Watch

Your local Wildlife Trusts belongs to a partnership of 47 local Wildlife Trusts throughout the UK, and Wildlife Watch is the junior branch of the Trusts. Wildlife Watch is one of the leading environmental clubs for children aged between 8 and 13 years. Wildlife Watch supports the National Curriculum and teachers in schools can run Wildlife Watch groups with the support of the local Wildlife Watch Officer.

## What do School Wildlife Watch Clubs do?

Wildlife Watch aims to enable young people to explore their natural surroundings, help them appreciate and understand the influences which have shaped their environment and involve them in taking action. This is achieved by teachers and/or other authorised and checked persons acting as leaders and running activities based on five principles, known as the Watch approach:

- Creating factual, informal, fun ways to investigate our surroundings
- Increasing understanding of our whole environment
- Fostering awareness and feeling for the world we live in
- Encouraging a caring attitude towards wildlife and participation in conservation
- Ensuring that young people's environmental concerns, ideas, and opinions are recognised and developed, and opportunities created to act upon them

In their School Watch clubs children can learn about their natural surroundings with activities that include minibeasts searching, pond dipping, bird box making, fungal forays, and wildlife gardening.
